napping her two daughters in 1977.

Meyer resigned from the San Bernardino Police Department under a cloud after Summers claimed police — particularly Meyer — coerced witnesses, lied in search warrant affidavits, embellished evidence unfavorable to Summers and disregarded other evidence.

Summers sued the police department and the city for violating his constitutional rights.

He settled the case out of court for \$400,000.

Meyer was in the spotlight only one other time in San Bernardino County — when he ran for sheriff in 1973.

During his unsuccessful campaign, he said criminals "who are not too smart to begin with," were nevertheless beating the criminal justice system.

As sheriff, he said, he would put a stop to such shenanigans.
