chosen because an attorney from that the office is representing another man charged in connection with the March 30, 1977, murder of Beverly Wise and the abduction of her children, Brandi Jondell Summers, then 5 years old, and Tiffani Wise, then 2.

Police believe the missing children were at Iwakiri's home several times between April 1977 and August 1979. Iwakiri's wife, Juanita, who has been charged in Idaho with felony child concealment, reportedly babysat the girls at her home at those times.

Michael Iwakiri told the grand jury he didn't know the children and that if they had been at his house to be babysat, they would

have been there three or four years ago, not several months ago.

Tuesday, Jordan submitted arguments asking for Iwakiri's release on his own recognizance or for a substantial reduction in bail. Some of the reasons Jordan listed were that Juanita Iwakiri was out on her own recognizance, that the couple are well-respected in their community and that Michael Iwakiri's employer can't hold his job open for him indefinitely.

Jordan said the publicity about the arrests has destroyed the babysitting business and that the couple will have to sell their home to pay attorney fees here and in Boise.

The bail reduction hearing is now scheduled for Monday.
