Summers had access to a roadmap that was found at the crime scene.

Summers claims he was in Utah on March 30, 1977, the day of the killing. Several defense witnesses have testified in support of that claim.

The defense claims that Summers is the victim of a faulty and unethical police investigation.

The police investigation, the most extensive in the city's history, has been the subject of controversy from its beginning. Meyer and another detective, John McDonald, took over the investigation in 1979 after the initial probe came to a standstill.

Meyer resigned from the police department last month after 23 years in law enforcement and

plans to work as a private investigator.

The grand jury investigated the case from February through March of 1980. No indictments were ever issued. Summers ultimately was charged in a criminal complaint filed by the district attorney's office, with murder and two counts of kidnap. Meyer is scheduled to return to the witness stand when the trial resumes today before Superior Court Judge William Pitt Hyde. The trial is in its 15th week.
