

# Extradition snag . . .

mers' family.

Canty was out of town Thursday and could not be reached for comment.

But Deputy District Attorney Frank Vanella, who is assisting Canty, said his office is "proceeding with the paperwork (required) as if he's not going to waive extradition."

Requests for extraditions must be approved by the governors of the states involved.

Vanella talked with Weiner Thursday, but told him it was up to Canty to determine whether specific hearing dates could be arranged.

Summers is charged with the March 30, 1977, stabbing death of Beverly Wise — one of his ex-wives — and the abduction of her two children, Brandi Jondell Sum-

mers, then 5 years old, and Tiffani Wise, then 2. Summers is Brandi's father.

The girls have never been found, but police reopened the investigation last September and say the girls have reportedly been seen in several western states in the last few years, most recently in February in Grass Valley, Calif.

Meanwhile, in a related matter, an Oregon judge Monday denied Summers' motion to have his divorce decree from Connie set aside. Connie — who has resumed her maiden name of Kohler — was granted a divorce by default from Summers in December.

Summers contended Monday that he was in jail when the decree was made and therefore unable to appear at the divorce hearing.

Emerson said Summers was contesting the divorce because he wanted some of his personal belongings back.
