



Jury convicts Boise woman

BOISE (UPI) — A Boise woman charged with second-degree kidnapping in connection with a California child was found guilty of the charge Thursday by an Idaho 4th District Court jury.

Judge Robert Newhouse ordered Juanita Iwakiri to appear for sentencing on June 19. The charge carries a one to 25-year prison sentence.

Jurors deliberated nearly six hours Thursday, beginning their discussion of the case early in the day after hearing final arguments late Wednesday.

Mrs. Iwakiri was charged with concealing at her Boise day-care center Tiffani Wise and her half-sister, Brandi Summers, who have been missing from their San Bernardino, Calif., home since March 30, 1977, when their mother, Beverly Wise, was found murdered in the home.
