the most recent ones:

✓ Sept. 30, 1979: Brandi was positively identified by several persons as having attended a church service in Garden City, Idaho, a suburb of Boise.

The city is a 46-block long conglomeration of bars, restaurants, recreational vehicle dealers and used car lots, wedged between Boise River and an 80-foot high cliff on the edge of Boise. About 60 persons telephoned police here and in Boise saying they had seen the girls and Summers in response to a news article and pictures that ran in the Boise Statesman.

✓ Early last fall: Both girls were identified as having attended a day-care school in Garden City. They had been going there about one year.

✓ Late summer and early fall last year: Both were seen playing outside in the community of Nampa, several miles west of Boise.

✓ Summer of 1979: Both girls were seen with Roy Summers in the same Nampa neighborhood.

✓ Summer of 1979: Brandi was seen by at least five persons in Manteca, Calif., at the home of her aunt, who is one of Roy Summers' sisters.

✓ Early summer of 1979: Brandi was seen in Fairfax, Va. (Another of Summers' sisters, Karen Carino, lives there. She has been charged with accessory to murder and kidnapping. Police believe that a few months after the children were abducted, they visited Carino's home in Pleasanton, Calif., where she then lived.)

✓ Summer of 1979: Tiffani was seen at an Elko apartment building at least 15 times. She was with a blonde woman in her 20s or 30s that detectives are still trying to locate. They believe she is a key to the whereabouts of the girls. In addition, Roy Summers was seen with the woman and at the same

apartment complex during that time. But he was never seen with the children.

✓ September through November 1977: Both girls were seen at least 150 times in Elko at a restaurant and hotel with Roy Summers.

✓ July and August 1977: The Pleasanton sighting with Roy, plus the youngsters were seen in Nampa without him.

Meanwhile, Summers is scheduled to stand trial Feb. 22 in Oregon on the attempted murder of his seventh wife, Connie. He is accused of twisting and breaking her arm while holding her beneath a car that was up on jacks. He allegedly attempted to kick the jacks out from under the car so it would fall on her, but was not successful.

Connie was granted a divorce from Summers in December and has resumed her maiden name of Kohler.
