

Extradition slow

FAIRFAX, Va. — It will be at least another month before Karen Carino, who is charged with being an accessory to the 1977 murder of Beverly Wise and the kidnapping of her two young daughters, may be extradited to California, court authorities here said Wednesday.

Assistant Commonwealth Attorney Thomas E. Gallahue said the governor's office in Richmond has yet to receive all the necessary information from the governor's office in California for Carino's extradition hearing.

The Virginia governor has up to 90 days after an arrest to hold such a hearing if extradition isn't waived, Gallahue said. Carino hasn't waived extradition.

San Bernardino Police believe the missing children, Brandi Jondell Summers and Tiffani Wise, visited Carino in her Pleasanton, Calif., home a few months after the March 30, 1977, killing. Carino later moved to Fairfax County.
