

Summers will remain in Oregon

Oregon Gov. Victor Atiyeh turned down a request Friday from Roy Summers that he be allowed to face murder and kidnapping charges in San Bernardino before standing trial on unrelated assault, kidnapping and attempted murder charges in Oregon.

Meanwhile, San Bernardino officials have only about one month left to get Summers' sister, Karen Carino of Virginia, extradited. She is also charged in the San Bernardino case.

Summers' request was made by his court-appointed attorney, Craig Emerson, on the heels of a ruling earlier this week by Oregon Circuit Court Judge Thomas Mosgrove that Summers must be tried there first.

Summers, 39, has waived extradition to California. He is charged with the 1977 murder of Beverly Wise of San Bernardino, one of his former wives, and with kidnapping and concealing two of her children, Brandi Jondell Summers, then 5, and Tiffani Wise, then 2. Summers is the older child's father. The children have never been found.

Atiyeh's legal counsel, Bob Oliver, said Friday that the governor decided not to interfere with the
