Continuance Granted

BOISE (UPI) — Idaho Fourth District Judge A. Richard Grant Wednesday granted a continuance in the preliminary hearing for a Boise woman charged with second-degree kidnapping in connection with the disappearance of two California girls.

Grant allowed the continuance to give the prosecution time to prepare its case against Juanita Iwakiri of Boise. The hearing will be held at 1:30, March 12.

Ms. Iwakiri was arrested earlier this month on the kidnap charge and kept jailed for three days in lieu of \$100,000 bail. Judge Gordon Lamm later

released her on her own recognizance, saying she was a good citizen in Boise and not a threat to the community.

Boise Police charged Ms. Iwakiri after she allegedly became involved with the disappearance of Tiffany Wise, 4, and her half-sister Brandi Johndell Summers, 8. The girls disappeared the day their mother, Beverly Wise, was murdered in their San Bernardino, Calif., home.

California detectives began searching for the girls in Idaho after they were reported seen in the Boise area. Ms. Iwakiri operates a day-care center where the girls allegedly were seen.
