into changing her story.

Tullis said she and Summers were living together in Livermore, Calif., until a couple of weeks before the killing. She said she moved to Utah because her relationship with Summers had deteriorated. (Summers threatened her and her family so badly during his drunken period, she said, that she nearly committed suicide).

But, she added, she agreed to let Summers join her in Utah, and he

arrived there on March 29 — just as he claims.

Moyle is Tullis' son. He says police first questioned him when the case was reopened in 1981, more than four years after the killing.

The teenager said, however, that he's sure it was "Dawn Patrol" that he saw that night, because police played the film for him and he specifically remembered certain scenes in the film.

The trial, which is expected to last at least three months, is scheduled to resume Monday before Superior Court Judge William Pitt Hyde.
